Another distinctive detail about this construction is the perfect acoustics. In fact, if you drop a pin on the stage, it will be heard even if your sitting at the last seats of the theater.

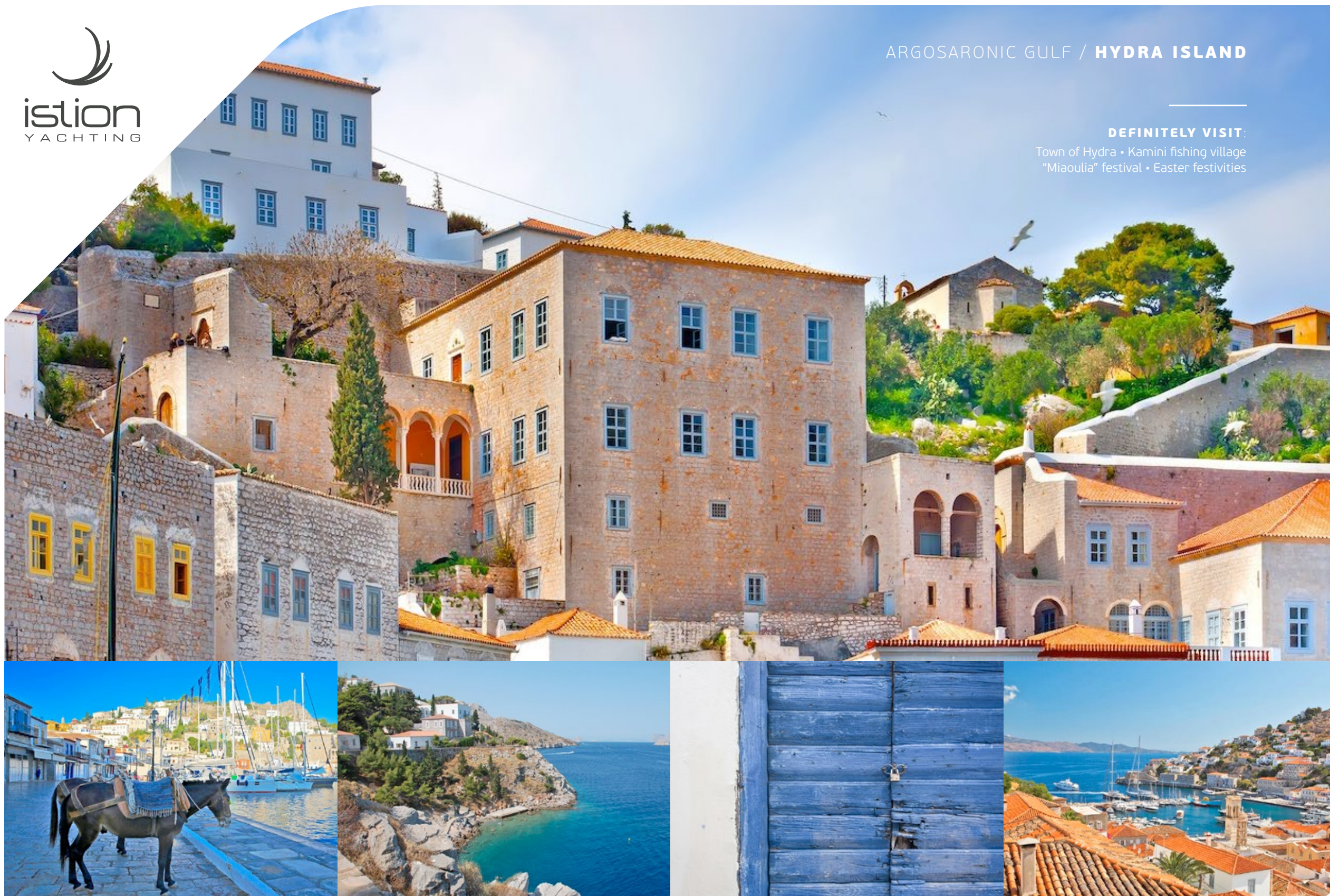
ARGOSARONIC GULF HYDRA ISLAND

ARGOSARONIC GULF SPETSES ISLAND

Its history, however, is much more exciting than that. Spetses is one of the Greek islands that played a major role to the Greek Revolution of 1821.
